# Paper Rocking Chairs



Artist and Vestal friend Josephine Durkin recently designed a set of 700 paper rocking chairs, in a piece called "Smile and Nod".

Everything is folded/slotted and no tape or adhesive of any kind is necessary to assemble the chair. It's just paper. Each have digital images printed on both sides. The chairs rock by way of a multi-colored oscillating fan and their rocking patterns change depending on where viewers are positioned in the room.

We met Josephine at Yale while working together with Natalie Jeremijenko on the Feral Robotic Dog Project. It's great to see what she's up to today.
